B. <u>PRESENTATION ON MONITORING PROJECT OF COMPULSIVE</u> <u>GAMING ASSISTANCE PLANS BY RACETRACK GAMING</u> <u>OPERATOR LICENSEES.</u>

Dr. Wiley D. Harwell will present his report on Responsible Gambling Assistance Plan for Remington Park and Will Rogers Downs for FY 2022-2023.

C. <u>RECOMMENDATION FROM THE OKLAHOMA-BRED ADVISORY</u> <u>COUNCIL.</u>

Background

The Oklahoma-Bred Advisory Council met on May 4th to discuss funding recommendations for the 2022-2023 Calendar and Fiscal Years. Recommendations are as follows:

- 1. The Oklahoma-Bred Council requests funding for CY 2023 Year-End Oklahoma-Bred Champion trophies of up to \$15,000.00, combined for all breeds.
- 2. The Oklahoma-Bred Council requests funding for CY 2023 (promotional advertising of the program in industry publications of up to \$50,000.00.)
- 3. The Advisory Council unanimously recommends Commission approval of funding for the annual promotional advertising of the program in industry publications with up to \$25,000.00 for the Quarter Horse, Paint and Appaloosa breeds and up to \$25,000.00 for the Thoroughbred breeds during CY 2023.

Possible Action:

Possible action may include, but is not limited to: taking no action, approving, in whole or in part, the recommendation(s), amending the funding amount, denying the funding request, or continuing the matter.

D. PROPOSED FY-2023 PARI-MUTUEL AND GAMING AUDITING CONTRACTS BETWEEN THE OKLAHOMA HORSE RACING COMMISSION AND THE OFFICE OF STATE AUDITOR AND INSPECTOR (SA&I).

Background

The Horse Racing Commission received proposed auditing contracts between the Commission and the Office of State Auditor and Inspector for FY-2023 for July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023. The pari-mutuel contract proposes a cost of \$162,500.00. The gaming contract proposes costs of \$58,797.84. The fees have remained the same from FY-2022.

Possible Executive Session

G. <u>PETITION FOR APPEALS FILED ON BEHALF OF AUSTIN</u> <u>GUSTAFSON (OWNER/TRAINER) ORDER NO. 21-RP-076, AND</u> <u>FELIPE MARTINEZ_MORALES (OWNER/TRAINER) ORDER NO.</u> <u>21-RP-077.</u>

On October 22, 2021, the Commission received a Petition for Appeals for Order 21-RP-076 filed on behalf of Austin Gustafson and a Petition for Appeals for Order 21-RP-077 filed on behalf of Felipe Martinez Morales.

Current Consideration

The Hearing before the Commission will be conducted pursuant to the authority and jurisdiction of the Oklahoma Administrative Procedures Act, Title 75, § 301 et seq., the Oklahoma Horse Racing Act, Title 3A O.S. § 200 et seq., OAC 325 (OHRC Rules of Racing), OAC 325:70-1-22, Grounds for Appeal from Decision of the Stewards, and OAC 325:70-1-24, Appeal Hearing Procedure.

The procedure for the Hearing before the Commission is set as follows:

1. The appellants, Austin Gustafson and Felipe Martinez-Morales and the Board of Stewards at Remington Park are entitled to be present and to present arguments.

2. The appellants, Austin Gustafson and Felipe Martinez-Morales or

their counsel will present oral arguments first, with the Board of Stewards or their counsel proceeding next. Each party will be allowed fifteen (15) minutes to present its case.

3. All parties are subject to questioning by Commissioners, Commission Staff and Commission Counsel.

Possible Executive Session

Pursuant to 25 O.S. § 307 (B)(8) and 311 (B)(1), an Executive Session may be proposed for the purpose of deliberations in an individual proceeding regarding Mr. Gustafson and Mr. Martinez-Morales Appeal of Stewards' Orders 21-RP-076 and 21-RP-077.

1. Motion and Vote to Go Into Executive Session for the Purpose Stated Above;

2. Motion and Vote to Reconvene in Open Session.
