#### RULE IMPACT STATEMENT

### TITLE 325. OKLAHOMA HORSE RACING COMMISSION CHAPTER 45. PROHIBITED PRACTICES AND EQUINE TESTING

#### (A) **PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED RULE:**

The proposed rule amendments modify definitions to conform and update language and standards of measurement; modify and clarify the permitted substances language; modify certain threshold limits; modify and clarify declaring the use of furosemide; strike current fines and penalties for violation of furosemide use while adopting standardize fines and penalties; strike current fines and penalties for violation of phenylbutazone use while adopting standardize fines and penalties; modify the substance classification and penalties to the current uniform version; modify the prohibited practice by adding an additional practice; modify the environmental contaminants disciplinary action regulatory threshold to the current version; and correct and update language.

# (B) <u>CLASSES OF PERSONS WHO MOST LIKELY WILL BE AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSED RULE AND ANY INFORMATION ON COST IMPACTS RECEIVED BY THE AGENCY FROM ANY PRIVATE OR PUBLIC ENTITIES:</u>

The proposed rules affect persons regulated by the Oklahoma Horse Racing Commission. No cost impacts have been received to date.

#### (C) PERSONS WHO WILL BENEFIT FROM THE PROPOSED RULE:

Persons who engage in the business of horse racing or place wagers on horse races in Oklahoma will benefit from the proposed rules.

Persons who engage in the business of horse racing will be provided with updated jurisdictional and administrative changes.
